The Family Time

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Proverbs 19:20 - Hear counsel, and receive instruction, that thou mayest be wise in thy latter end. Proverbs 19:21 - [There are] many devices in a man's heart; nevertheless the counsel of the LORD, that shall stand.

In our last session, we looked at how important it is that we accept Godly counsel. We took a look at the fact that very often youth today reject the counsel of those who have passed through the challenges of life. Adventist Home, page 73.2, told us that:

- 1. If you are blessed with God-fearing parents, seek counsel of them.
- 2. Open to them your hopes and plans;
- **3.** Learn the lessons which their life experiences have taught. { Adventist Home, page 73.2}

Even those of us who are older, should always seek Godly counsel: It is truly amazing how much useful advice we overlook.

- 1. Men and women who are otherwise sensible and conscientious close their ears to counsel; they are deaf to the appeals and entreaties of friends and kindred and of the servants of God.
- 2. The expression of a caution or warning is regarded as impertinent meddling, and the friend who is faithful enough to utter a remonstrance is treated as an enemy.
- 3. All this is as Satan would have it. He weaves his spell about the soul, and it becomes bewitched, infatuated.
- **4.** Reason lets fall the reins of self-control upon the neck of lust; unsanctified passion bears sway, until, too late, the victim awakens to a life of misery and bondage.
- 5. This is not a picture drawn by the imagination, but a recital of facts. God's sanction is not given to unions which He has expressly forbidden. { Adventist Home, page 61.2}

We long for love. Why? We are made in the image of God. God is love. Therefore love is a part of our being. Adventist Home, page 67.3 says:

- 1. The heart yearns for human love, but this love is not strong enough, or pure enough, or precious enough to supply the place of the love of Jesus.
- **2.** Only in her Savior can the wife find wisdom, strength, and grace to meet the cares, responsibilities, and sorrows of life. She should make Him her strength and her guide.
- **3.** Let woman give herself to Christ before giving herself to any earthly friend, and enter into no relation which shall conflict with this.
- **4.** Those who would find true happiness must have the blessing of Heaven upon all that they possess and all that they do.
- 5. It is disobedience to God that fills so many hearts and homes with misery.
- 6. My sister, unless you would have a home where the shadows are never lifted, do not unite yourself with one who is an enemy of God. {AH 67.3}

So how is true love accomplished?

- **1.** The Holy Spirit comes to the soul as a Comforter.
- **2.** By the transforming agency of His grace, the image of God is reproduced in the disciple; he becomes a new creature.
- **3.** Love takes the place of hatred, and the heart receives the divine similitude.
- **4.** This is what it means to live "by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." This is eating the Bread that comes down from heaven. {DA 391.1}

So what is the advice for our youth regarding counsel on the matter of relationships?

- 1. If children would be more familiar with their parents, if they would confide in them and unburden to them their joys and sorrows, they would save themselves many a future heartache.
- **2.** When perplexed to know what course is right, let them lay the matter just as they view it before their parents, and ask advice of them.
- **3.** Who are so well calculated to point out their dangers as godly parents?
- **4.** Who can understand their peculiar temperaments so well as they?
- **5.** Children who are Christians will esteem above every earthly blessing the love and approbation of their God-fearing parents.
- **6.** The parents can sympathize with the children and pray for and with them that God will shield and guide them. Above everything else they will point them to their never-failing Friend and Counselor. {AH 73.3}
