Lesson # 3: "A Royal Priesthood" – 1st and 2nd Peter



A Royal Priesthood

Main Text for The Week: "But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9, KJV).

Read and Meditate on these Texts:

1 Pet. 2:1-3; Heb. 4:12; 1 Pet. 2:4-8; Isa. 28:16; Exod. 19:3-6; 1 Pet. 2:5,9,10

Main Thought for the Week: In this week's study, Peter points the Jewish converts to Christianity and helps them to understand that as much as Israel was chosen by God, so is the Church and it is in no way inferior to Judaism. As much as Israel had a priesthood, so Christians are a holy priesthood called to offer up spiritual sacrifices to God as priests before Him (1 Peter 2:5). In other words, man is no longer in need of an earthly priest, except his great High Priest, Jesus, who is passed into the heavens. It is through Him who is seated at the right hand of the Father that we serve as our own priest before God.

The Living Stone

Monday's Summary – April 10:

SUMMARY THOUGHTS: After telling his readers to seek spiritual nourishment, Peter immediately directs their attention to Jesus Christ, the Living Stone, most likely a reference to the Jerusalem temple. In *1 Peter 2:4-8*, he cites three Old Testament passages that highlight the significance of cornerstones, which represent the role of Jesus in His church. Peter is not alone in linking these verses to Jesus. Jesus Himself uses *Psalm 118:22* at the conclusion of one of His parables (*Matt. 21:42*). Peter does likewise in *Acts 4:11*, in his speech to the Jewish leadership. And Paul uses *Isaiah 28:16 in Romans 9:33*.

Discussion Thought: "Covenant" (Hebrew, *berit*) is a word that describes a treaty or formal agreement between two parties. It could be made between two individuals (for example, Laban and Jacob in Genesis 31:44) or between two kings (for example, Solomon and Hiram in 1 Kings 5:12, where *berit* is translated as "league" in the KJV, and "treaty" in the NRSV). It could also be made between a king and his people, such as David and the elders of Israel (2 Sam. 5:3).
