Lesson # 6: "Suffering For Christ" – 1st and 2nd Peter



Suffering For Christ

Main Text for The Week: "For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps:" (1 Peter 2:21, KJV).

Read and Meditate on these Texts:

1 Pet. 1:6, 3:13-22, 2 Tim. 3:12, 1 Pet. 4:12-14, Rev. 12:17, 1 Pet. 4:17-19

Main Thought for the Week: Suffering of believers for Christs' sake is one of the major themes of Peter in the First Epistle that he has written. There are at least three extended passages that deal with his readers' suffering for Christ: 1 Peter 2:18-25; 3:13-21; 4:12-19. Jesus is our example. He endured punishment unjustly. He suffered mercilessly at the hands of His persecutors, not because of any evil He had done, yet He was exposed to suffering. As Christians, followers of Christ, we must expect the same, and when it comes, bear it in the same spirit and commit yourself to your heavenly Father above with the help of the Holy Spirit.

Persecution of Early Christians

Sunday's Summary – April 30:

Discussion Thought: When we are assailed and grieved by various trials, we must rejoice in God's keeping power, with the understanding that God has a purpose, not only in permitting the trials but for the heavy grief we experience during the trials. He is able to keep you faithful during the fiery ordeals of life. - 1 Cor. 10:13, Phil. 1:6, Jude 1:24.

Suffering and the Example of Christ

Monday's Summary - May 1:

SUMMARY THOUGHTS: When Peter says, "if ye suffer for righteousness' sake, happy are ye" (1 Pet. 3:14, KJV), he is just echoing the words of Jesus: "'blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake'" (Matt. 5:10, KJV). He then says that Christians should not fear those who are attacking them, but they should sanctify Christ as Lord in their hearts (1 Pet. 3:15). This affirmation of Jesus in their own hearts will help to buffer the fear that they face from those opposing them.

Judgment and the People of God

Wednesday's Summary - May 3:

Discussion Thought: In biblical times, judgment was usually something highly desired. The picture of the poor widow in **Luke 18:1-8** captures the wider attitude toward judgment. The widow knows that she will prevail in her case if only she can find a judge who will take her case. She has insufficient money and status to get her case heard, but she finally persuades the judge to hear it and to give her what she deserves. As Jesus says, "And shall God not avenge His own elect which cry day and night unto Him?" (Luke 18:7, KJV). Sin has brought evil into the world, and God's people throughout the ages have long waited for God to make things right again.

Friday's Summary – May 5:

Meditate on this stirring inspired counsel found in the book **Great Controversy**, **Pages 614-615**

"Those who honor the law of God have been accused of bringing judgments upon the world, and they will be regarded as the cause of the fearful convulsions of nature and the strife and bloodshed among men that are filling the earth with woe. The power attending the last warning has enraged the wicked; their anger is kindled against all who have received the message and Satan will excite to still greater intensity the spirit of hatred and persecution."
